



## Preview Women's 53kg

- Hsu Shu-Ching (TPE, G3-S3-B1) has collected seven world championships medals in women's 53kg events, only trailing Zulfiya Chinshanlo (KAZ, 8) and Chen Xiaoting (CHN, 9).
- Hsu has claimed three world titles in the women's 53kg category. Only Chinshanlo (7), Chen (5), Li Feng-Ying (TPE, 5) and Li Ping (CHN, 4) have claimed more.
- Hsu is aiming to become the first athlete to claim a world title in a women's 53kg event in three editions in a row.
- Hsu could become the first athlete to reach the podium in a women's 53kg event at four different editions of the world championships.
- Supattra Kaewkhong (THA) and Sopita Tanasan (THA) are both hoping to become the first world champion from Thailand in a women's 53kg event since 2005, when Prapawadee Jaroenrattanatarakoon (THA) took the Snatch title.
- Joanna Lochowska (POL) is aiming to become the first European athlete to reach the world championships podium in a women's 53kg event since 2013, when Iulia Paratova (UKR) collected bronze in Snatch..
- The last world champion from Poland in any women's event was Agata Wrobel (POL) who took gold in Clean & Jerk and Total in the +75kg category in 2002.
- Lochowska (29) could become the oldest world champion in a women's 53kg event. Li Feng-Ying (TPE) currently holds the record as she was 26 years old when she clinched gold in both Snatch and Total in 2001.
- Rosane Dos Reis Santos (BRA) could become the second world champion from South America in a women's 53kg event, after Alexandra Escobar (ECU) who triumphed in Clean & Jerk in 2001.
