



Preview Women's 90kg

- The women's 90kg category will make its world championships debut.
- Anastasiia Hotfrid (GEO), who won all three titles in the women's 90kg at the 2017 European Junior & Under 23 Championships, could become Georgia's first medal winner in women's weightlifting at the world championships.
- The last athlete from Georgia to claim all three world titles in a single weight category was Georgi Asanidze (GEO, men's 85kg in 2001).
- Crismery Dominga Santana Peguero (DOM) won Snatch gold in the women's 90kg at the 2017 Pan American Championships and could hand Dominican Republic its first ever world title in any event (male or female).
- The last medallist from Dominican Republic was Yuderqui Contreras (DOM), who finished second in the Snatch in the women's 53kg category at the 2011 World Championships.
- Lo Ying-Yuan (TPE) collected silver in all three women's 90kg events at the 2017 Asian Championships, while 17-year-old Shi Jiaqi (CHN) claimed all three titles in this weight category.
- Eileen Floanna Maria Cikamatana (FIJ) reached the podium in all three events in women's 90kg at the 2017 Junior World Championships (G0-S2-B1) and is now hoping to become Fiji's first ever medal winner, male or female, in world championships history.
