Athletes <u>MUST</u> wear;

A weightlifting costume
Sport footwear

Optional (4.1.2)

Athletes <u>MAY</u> wear any of the following

- Unitard
- T-shirt
- Shorts
- Socks
- Belt
- Bandage(s)
- Sticking plaster(s)
- Tape(s)

- Gloves
- Palm Guard(s)
- Undergarment(s)
- Jewelry / Accessories
- Hair Adornment(s)
- Religious head gear / Head gear

Individual rules apply for each item

Socks (in 4.1.2)

Socks may be worn.



These are all OK !!

Costume (4.2)

Athletes must wear only one costume which complies with the following criteria: (4.2.1)

- Must be one piece.
- Must be collar-less
- May be of any colour
- Must not cover the elbows
- Must not cover the knees

The rule 4.7.4 says also "A T-shirt and shorts cannot be worn instead of the costume."

Costume may be loose fitting

Athletes must wear sport footwear.



If used, it must be worn on the outside of the costume (4.4.1)



Maximum width is 12cm (4.4.2)

Bandages, Sticking Plasters and Tapes (4.5)

What is bandages? (4.5.1) Non-adhesive wraps made of a variety of materials. Most common materials are;



- Gauze
- **Medical crepe**
- Neoprene / rubber
- Leather



Rules for Bandages



- Wrist bandages must not cover more area cither on skin or on unitard.
- One-piece kneecaps / patella protectors may not be reinforced by way of buckles, straps, whalebone, plastic or wire. (4.5.1.2)
- Bandages on hands may be <u>attached to wrist</u>. (4.5.1.3)
- Bandages must <u>not</u> be attached to barbell at any time (4.5.1.4)
- Any bandage worn on the trunk must be worn <u>under the</u> <u>costume</u> (4.5.1.5)

WF

No bandages or substitutes are allowed within 10cm of the elbow area. (4.5.1.6)

10cm of the elbow area means



5cm above the elbow 5cm below the elbow

IWF

No bandage, no sticking plaster, no tape within this 10cm area

What we can...

Bandage, anywhere but not for elbows

"Double bandages"

Costume / socks covering bandages







What we cannot...

Reinforced kneecaps

Bandage(s) attached to the barbell

Bandage within 10cm of the elbow area



Bandages, <u>Sticking</u> Plasters and Tapes (4.5)

What is Sticking Plasters? (4.5.2) Small adhesive bandages usually made of;

- Woven fabric
- Plastic

with an absorbent pad

Latex rubber

Sticking plasters are applied to cover small wounds.



Sticking Plasters

Can

Be worn to protect small wounds (4.5.2.1)

Cannot

Be worn within 10cm of the elbow area (4.5.1.6 and 4.5.3.4 cover this rule)

WF

Protrude in front of fingertips (4.5.2.2) = Only as same area as finger(s) / thumb(s)

Be attached to the barbell (4.5.2.3)

Bandages, Sticking Plasters and Tapes (4.5)

What is Tape? (4.5.3)

Made of either rigid cotton or rayon material and is known as;
Athletic tape

- Medical tape
- Sport tape

Tape can an elastic therapeutic tape (Kinesio tape, an adhesive elastic cotton strip) also.



What we can...

Tape, anywhere but not for elbows

Tapes on hands may be <u>attached</u>to wrist. (4.5.3.2)

May be worn under any piece of outfit including other bandages anywhere on the body, except elbow(s). (4.5.3.5)



Can be also under the costume



Tape, under socks



Kinesio tape, under costume and bandage

What we cannot...

Tape, protrude in front of fingertips (4.5.3.1) = Only as same area as finger(s) / thumb(s) Tape, attached to the barbell (4.5.3.3)

Tape, worn <u>within 10cm of the elbow</u> area (4.5.3.4)



Gloves and Palm Guards (4.6)

- Wearing fingerless gloves is allowed (4.6.1)
 - ex. Gymnastic palm guards, cycling gloves
- Gloves may cover only the first knuckle of the fingers (4.6.2)
- If sticking plaster or tape is worn on the fingers, there must be a visible separation between the sticking plaster / tape and the palm guard / glove. (4.6.3)



Need a visible separation with



WF

Unitard (4.7.1)

Only one unitard may be worn under the costume.

The unitard is considered as the skin

Must comply with the following criteria:

WF

- One piece or two pieces
- Tight fitting

Collarless

- May cover the elbows and knees
- May be of any colour
- No pattern or design permitted

OK!!

T-shirt (4.7.2)

Only one T-shirt may be worn under the costume.

Must comply with the following criteria:

- Must be collarless
- May not cover the elbows
- May be of any colour



IWF

"High neck" is not the collar. This is OK !!

Shorts (4.7.3)

Only one pair of shorts may be worn under the costume and the shorts must not be longer than the costume.





WF

"No" for better looking

Must comply with the following criteria:

- Tight fitting
- Must not cover the knees
- May be of any colour

Unitard Bottoms / Leggings are not considered as shorts.



Any of those are all OK!!



Rule 4.7.6

"At competitions, athletes participate in <u>the</u> <u>uniform clothing issued / approved by their</u> <u>Member Federation</u>. For this purpose, the Victory Ceremony is considered to be part of the competition."

WF

Don't use competition and/or Victory Ceremony for appealing your ideology!!

Personal Electronic Devices (4.8)



IWF

Except for medical equipment if that does not assist in execution of the lift.

Manufacturer Identification (4.9)

IWF

At all IWF Events, the following identifications are permitted on each article of athletes outfit with the total maximum size of 500cm per article (4.9.1)

a) the identification (logo, name or combination of both) of the manufacturer of the product and/or

b) the identification of their commercial sponsor (logo, name or combination of both)

Distinct patterns of a manufacturer are not considered for this measurement of the application.

At Olympic Games and YOG, relevant IOC rules prevail. (4.9.2)
